Wait, what? You're going to be gone how long???

Friends, as most of you know, I will be starting a sabbatical on Sunday May 18th and will be back in worship with you all on August 3rd. I am grateful to the Session for including this in my covenant. The timing couldn't be better as Gavin, and I are able to take our sabbaticals at the same time. This is a first for us.

Well, where are you going?

We will be traveling in Japan, China, Southeast Asia, Indonesia, Australia, French Polynesia and ending in Hawaii. We have a four-day tour of Tokyo before we leave on May 22nd for a 72-night cruise that will take us to all the above locales. We decided that this would be the way we would spend our sabbatical back in October of 2023. We will see a large part of the world, but as we will be staying aboard the ship, we will only have to unpack and repack once.

Have you ever been to that part of the world?

I have never been to Asia or Australia – everywhere we are going will be a new adventure. We are particularly interested in learning more about the religious traditions and culture that are native to this part of the world.

Are we going to get to see pictures?

My plan is to talk about our trip during worship on August 3rd, sharing a video of where I felt most attune to the presence of the Holy Spirit.

So what's going to happen while you are gone? Who's going to preach?

That's the exciting part! I have arranged for pastors from across the presbytery – men and women, ordained ministers and ruling elders and a seminarian, both black and white – to be with you to lead worship and preach. These folks are the best! Many of them have been here before, so they come as friends and not as strangers. These are all folks who I love and admire, and I know that you will as well.

But what happens if someone dies or there is an emergency?

Speaking of people I admire, I have asked Rev. Dr. Rodney Foster if he would be on call for pastoral emergencies. Folks who have been here longer than me know Rodney from his former ministry with this congregation, and I know Rodney from our work together at the Presbytery. I know he will be there for you and be of comfort should you need that. However, if you have a need for pastoral care, please first call the Elder on Call. If you are not sure who to call, call the church office and Susan will let you know who the Elder for that week is. The elder on call will reach out to Rodney for his assistance when necessary.

Can we do anything for you while you are gone?

I would only ask that you remember Gavin and I in your prayers while we are away. I will certainly be holding this community in my heart and prayers while I am gone.

Welcome As Our Guest Preacher for Worship on Sunday, May 25, 2025 Holly Bannan





In May, June and July, Communion will be on the SECOND Sunday.


Please make sure that you bring your food with you to worship. There will be baskets to collect the food in front of the communion table.

In March 2025, total revenues exceeded total expenses by \$14,899 with year to date total revenues exceeding year to date expenses by \$11,511.

In March 2025, envelope income was over budget by \$15,019 and over budget YTD by \$504.

Highlights of the Session Meeting on April 15, 2025

At its Tuesday, April 15 meeting your session members continued to discuss being Spirit-led after reading chapter four of the book titled, Sailboat Church: Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice. These quotes summarize the chapter: "The church is a divine, even supernatural, community gathered by God to do God's work," and "Now you ARE the body of Chriet and individually members of it."

Pastor Jen informed the Session that because our insurance company now requires all outside groups to have liability insurance with the church as second insured that the AA/CA groups are no longer meeting at JCPC. She expressed her sorrow over this matter as did the Session members but a way out of it was not possible.

A motion from CE Committee to extend the hiatus on Sunday school to include August 3 and to have the Church Buddy Breakfast on August 10 to kick off Sunday school for 2025-26 was approved. Session having previously approved the request of the Interfaith Alliance of South Carolina's request to have JCPC host in the Fellowship Hall a viewing of Banned Together, it was announced that the movie will be shown on Monday, April 28, at 7:00 PM followed by a panel discussion.

Myra Horton reported on a meeting with Tom Shearin and Chris Webb, the landscape and playground designer who will be guiding the construction of the JCPC "backyard sanctuary." They now have a drawing of the plan and the next step is a solution to the water pooling on the property when it rains. Pastor Jen went over the detailed plans and Sessional duties during her Sabbatical. All dates have been filled with Presbytery pastors and contingency plans are in place.
