## Christ is Risen! Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

Despite what many think, Easter is not only a day, but an entire season in the church year. It is when our vestments (the fabric on the pulpit and the communion table) get changed to white, and we are reminded to live into resurrection, because in the words of the Apostle Paul, "we are raised with Christ." (Colossians 3:1)

So what might that mean, to live as resurrection people? We know that God's love can never die. We know that the light of Christ can never be extinguished. We know too that we will experience resurrection for as Paul in his letter to the Romans reminds us,

...don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. (Romans 6:3-5)

But what does that *mean*? It reminds us that we need to live a life worthy of the calling that we have received from God through our Lord, Jesus Christ. We need to follow the ways of Jesus and trust that the God who raised Jesus to new life, will and has done that for us. We have been clothed with Christ so that we can make a difference in the world. Participating with God in all that God is doing.

We are the hands and feet of God (Creator, Christ and Holy Spirit) and we are called to love all the world as God does. Not to sit around and wait for God to act, but to allow the spirit to work through us to accomplish God's will in the world. This is why the resurrection matters! We are raised with Christ through our baptism to live in the world as Christ's people for the salvation of the world. That means we have to love, we have to care, we have to serve, we do what we can

to combat the forces of evil in the world – that we all know are legion.



What does the Presbyterian symbol mean?


What do Presbyterians believe about God, Jesus, the Bible, love, grace, marriage?


